! LOOK! Tier 3 Funding Requirement Announcement: The "OK-LSAMP Retreat" listed as a Tier 3 requirement for Spring '24 will not occur this spring. In its place, we ask that Scholars participate in an outreach activity that allows them to bring their research experiences and STEM knowledge to K-12 students, their communities, or Tribes. Think broadly! Activities could range from formal presentations to doing basic hands-on science activities with students to help them understand that STEM is fun, interesting, and accessible to them. You can volunteer to participate in an existing outreach program/activity or develop your own. Photos and a brief 2-3 sentence summary of the activity, including information regarding who benefited from your outreach, will be required as documentation of the activity and also so we can celebrate your contributions.
